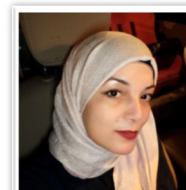

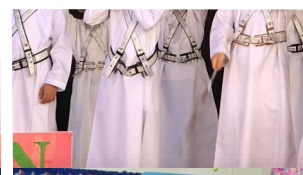

teachers.

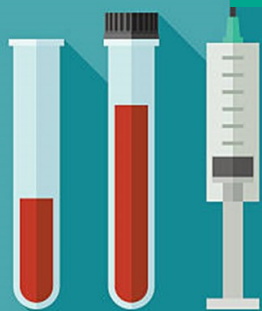

Love yourself. Nothing is more powerful than loving yourself. Do not think of yourself as a loser, or a misfortune or disgrace. You are in such situation because some one more powerful believes that you should be there, embrace your circumstances and thrive in it. Life is about surviving everything that comes along. If you fall, stand; if you trip, stand; if you stumble stand. Never get tired of getting up after falling. Give yourself the love that you deserve and slowly breathe back the life, that this mental difficulty has taken away from you.

Note to the Community. Mental disorder is quite a hard battle, one will never understand the depth and breadth of this situation unless one is in it. Let us be more compassionate, more patient and less criticizing to people, this way we do can show respect to everyone's own unique story.

Floppy met John's sister and they all played together.

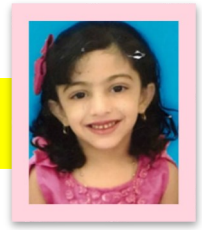
Out of nowhere, two men came and grabbed John, Annie and Floppy. The bad guys wanted to eat them. They asked John and Annie where they live.

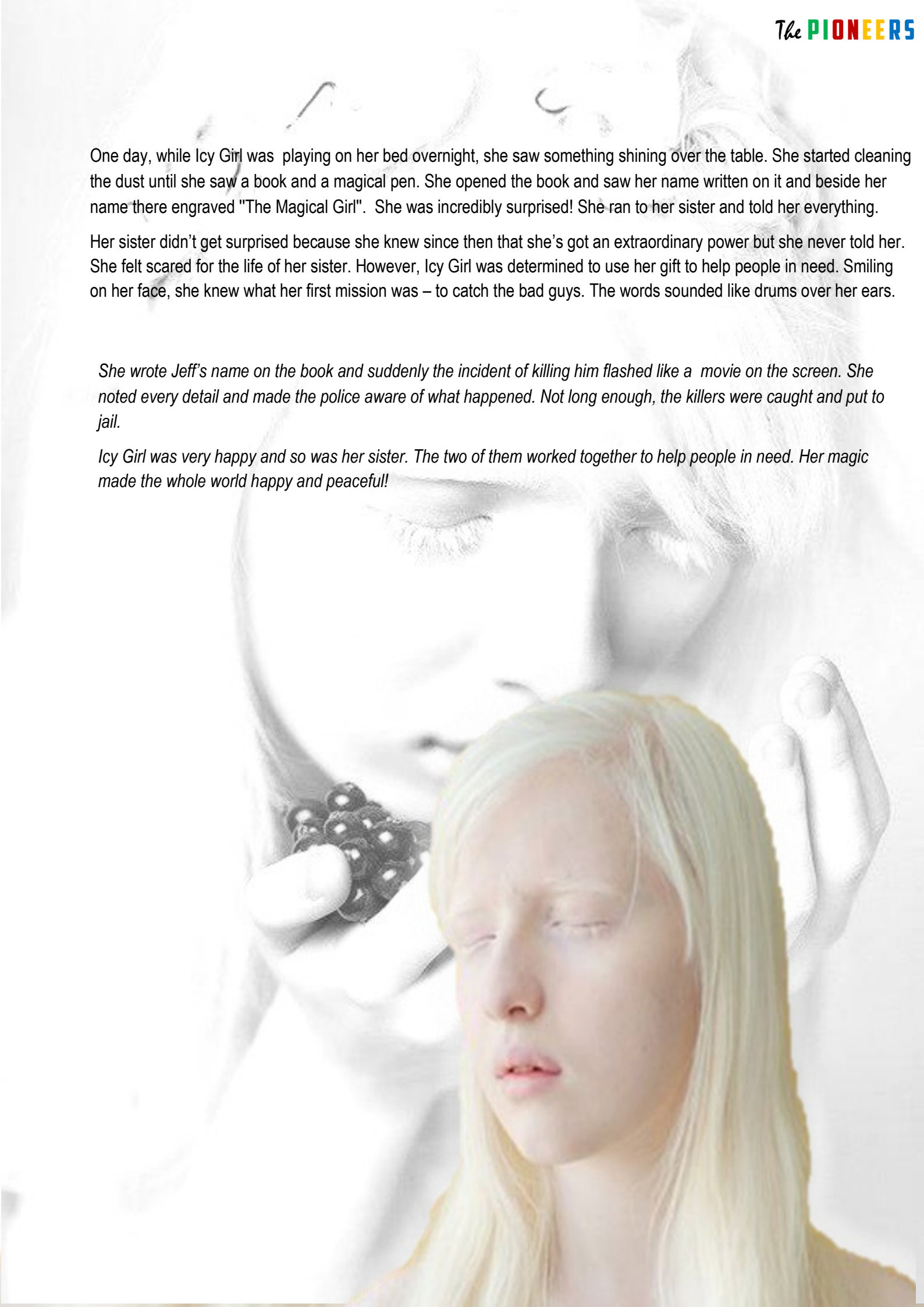
Icy girl was so devastated. Jeff had been a pretty good man to him. She wished she had a magic to catch the bad guys and make them pay the death of their friend Jeff.
